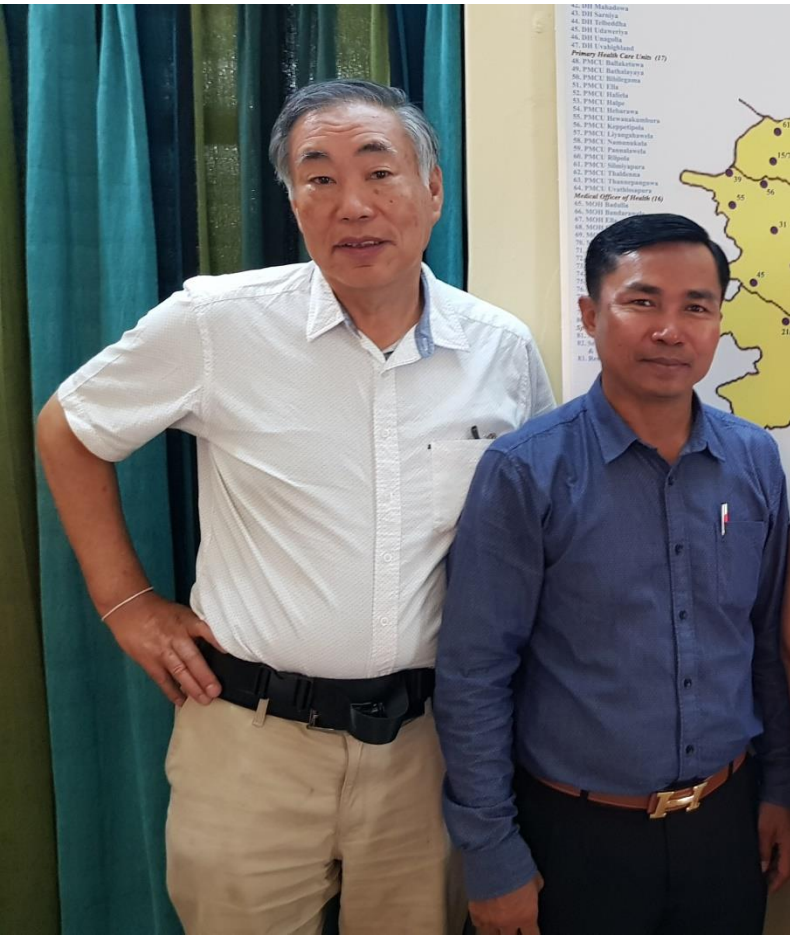

## Why it was selected?

### ❖ Demographic information

- ❖ Population: 1358 (F: 681) in 2011;
- ❖ Land Area: 3.45 km<sup>2</sup> (6 km from the town)
- ❖ Religion: 100% villagers are Muslims
- ❖ Number of Household: 269,
- ❖ Family: 325
- ❖ Main occupation: fishing
- ❖ Sanitation facility: 15
- ❖ Health insurance: 48 families covered by “SKY”
- ❖ The most dirty village in Kampot province

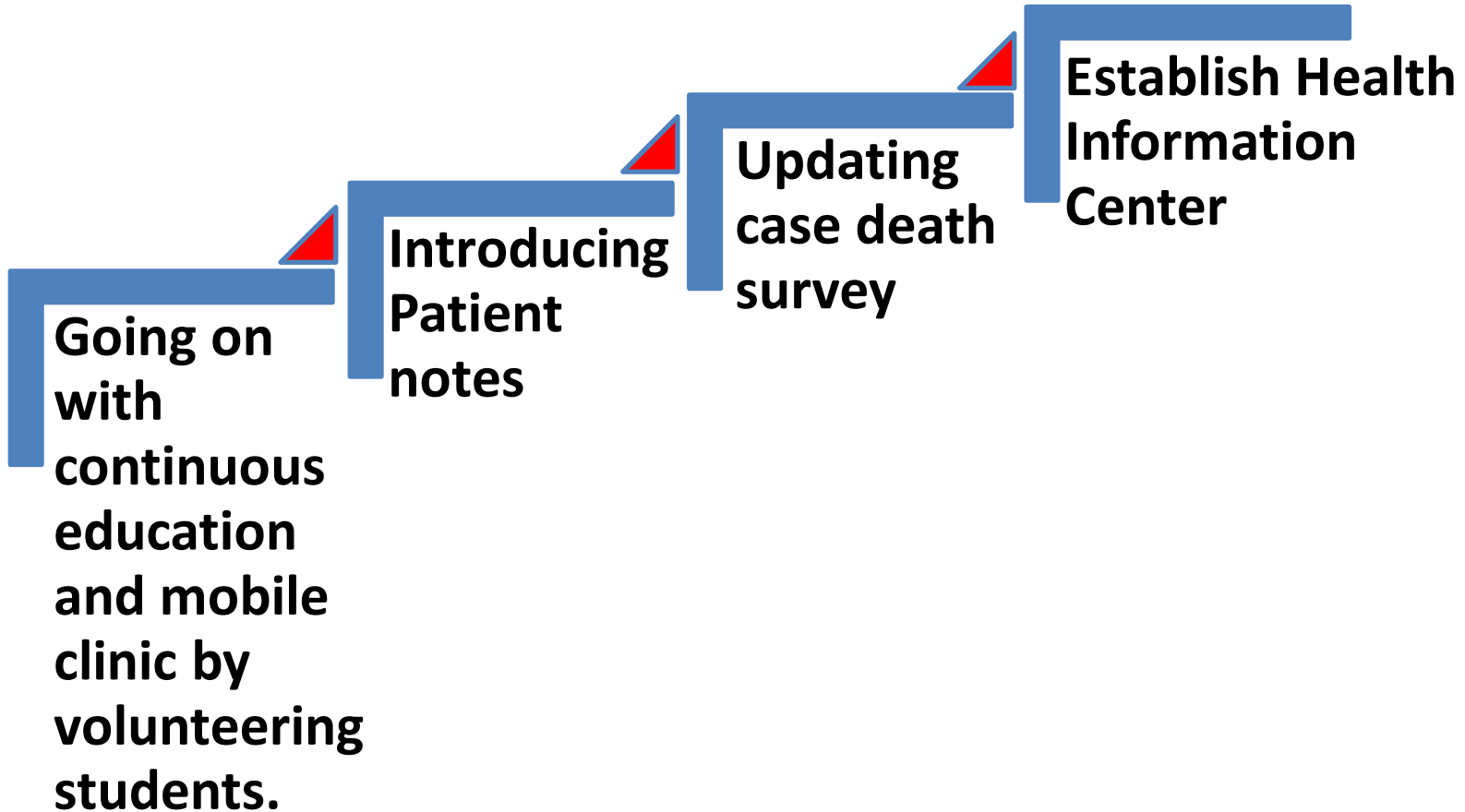
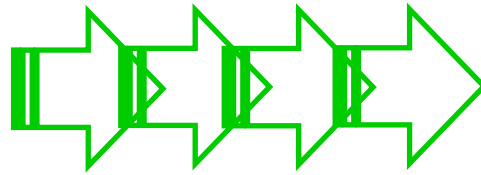
